Attached are a few pics of the ether, mercury, and some of the flammables in the shed. There is an identical container of ether on the shelf behind the one in the picture but I don't know how full they are.

House is a brick rambler with full basement, probably built sometime in the 1950s. There is a large plywood shed about 10' X 15' in the southeast corner of the lot which is where the ether and most of the flammables and corrosives are stored. The chemicals inside the house are found in a makeshift lab down in the southeast corner of the basement. The mercury is stored in a cabinet in the basement near the lab.

We didn't see any evidence of a fresh mercury spill. Our Jerome meter picked up between 0.40 and 0.52 micrograms mercury per cubic meter of air at five different locations in the upstairs portion of the house, with values ranging from 0.55 to 16.69 micrograms mercury per cubic meter at nine different locations in the basement. The highest number was from an air sample collected about 6 inches off the floor of the lab.

I alerted the homeowner that you would be coming tonight or tomorrow morning and she is expecting you. Give me a call when you want to meet out there.
